Ukraine has long been known for its fertile black soil filled with fields of wheat and rows of sunflowers. But even amidst Russia's war on Ukraine, there's something else Ukraine's soil has proven fertile for: new churches.

That's why when Carmel Baptist Church in Matthews, North Carolina had a dream to plant 25 churches in the next decade — and a long-term, trusted partnership with UBTS — they knew Ukraine could be a good place to start.

"So many Ukrainians are living in fear, trauma, and depression today," says Sergiy Vorona, director of the Church Planting Department at UBTS. "**The war doesn't cancel the Great Commission.** Instead, it calls the Church to become more active, to draw closer to people, and to reach more communities."

Today, this partnership fuels churches like Frontline which formed after Christians in Kharkiv, Ukraine gave a neighborhood bomb shelter new life — and then planted a church from the community that formed.

"They're ministering to people in a very difficult situation where there's constant Russian attacks," shares Tim Wishon, who leads Carmel's church planting partnership with UBTS. "And yet, churches are not only getting started, they're bringing new people in, making disciples, and baptizing people."

"It reminds us that God is still working, even in the hardest places."

“We were there,” says Katya, who serves with the WeCare Center in Kryvyi Rih. “We saw how they pulled out the bodies. We saw how in a single moment a person who was carefree, young... suddenly their whole life just collapses.”

Katya had been mentoring Nastia for several years when the 20-year-old young woman received the call: her fiancé was buried under thirteen feet of rubble after a Russian attack.

Nastia turned to the WeCare Center community for support, and says now that these believers upheld her during the following months of grief.

Despite the daily dangers of ministering in a city 50 miles from the frontline, Katya can’t imagine life anywhere else. “There were opportunities to leave, but it wouldn’t have felt right. Here, my day, my life, has meaning. I know I’m needed here.”

“We want our partners to understand that, yes, it’s hard, but nothing can stop us from serving,” Katya says. “And of course, **we need support and prayers, because we aren’t doing our own work – we are doing God’s work.** Sometimes it’s just comforting to know you’re not alone.”



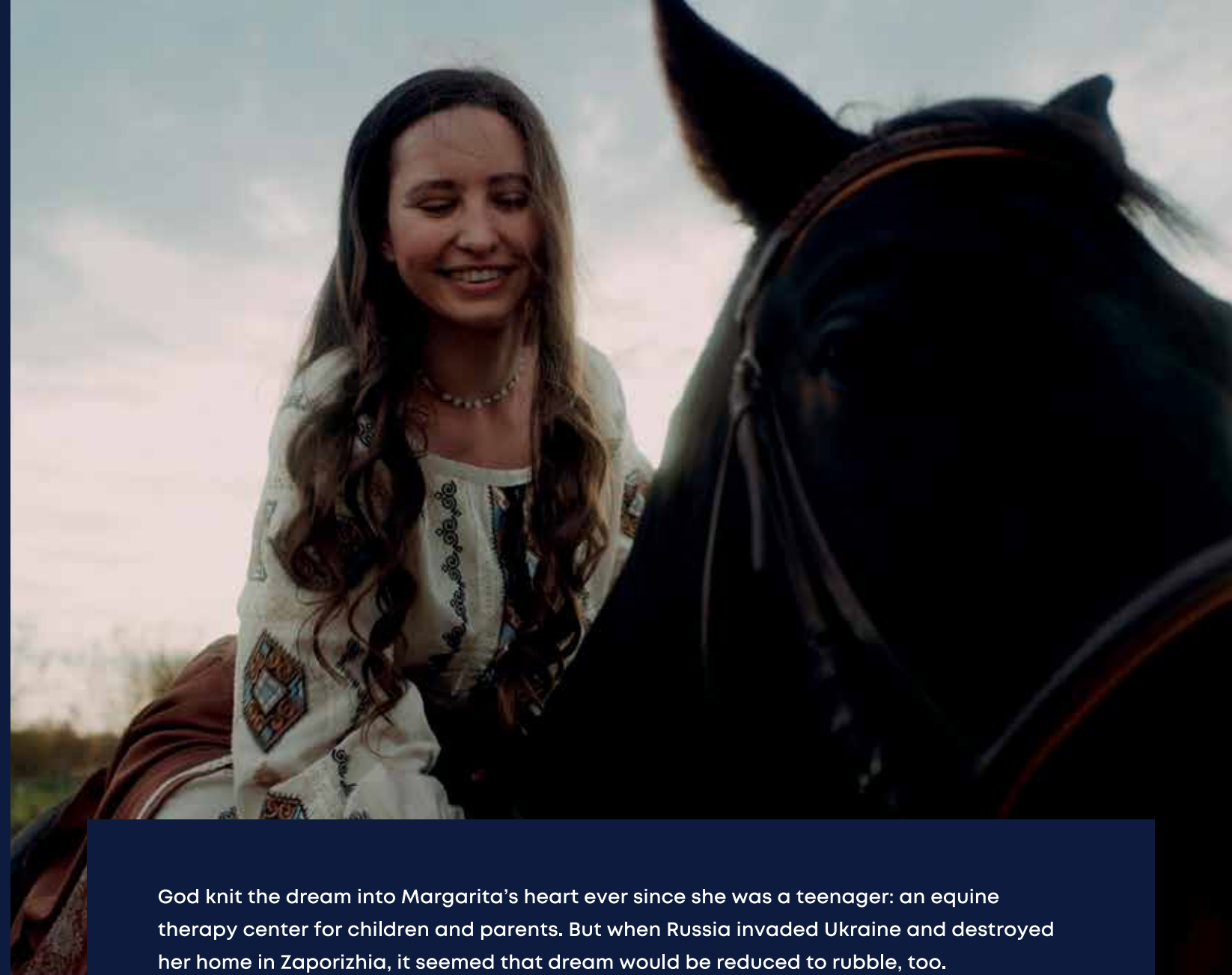


INSTITUTE FOR LEADERSHIP AND COACHING

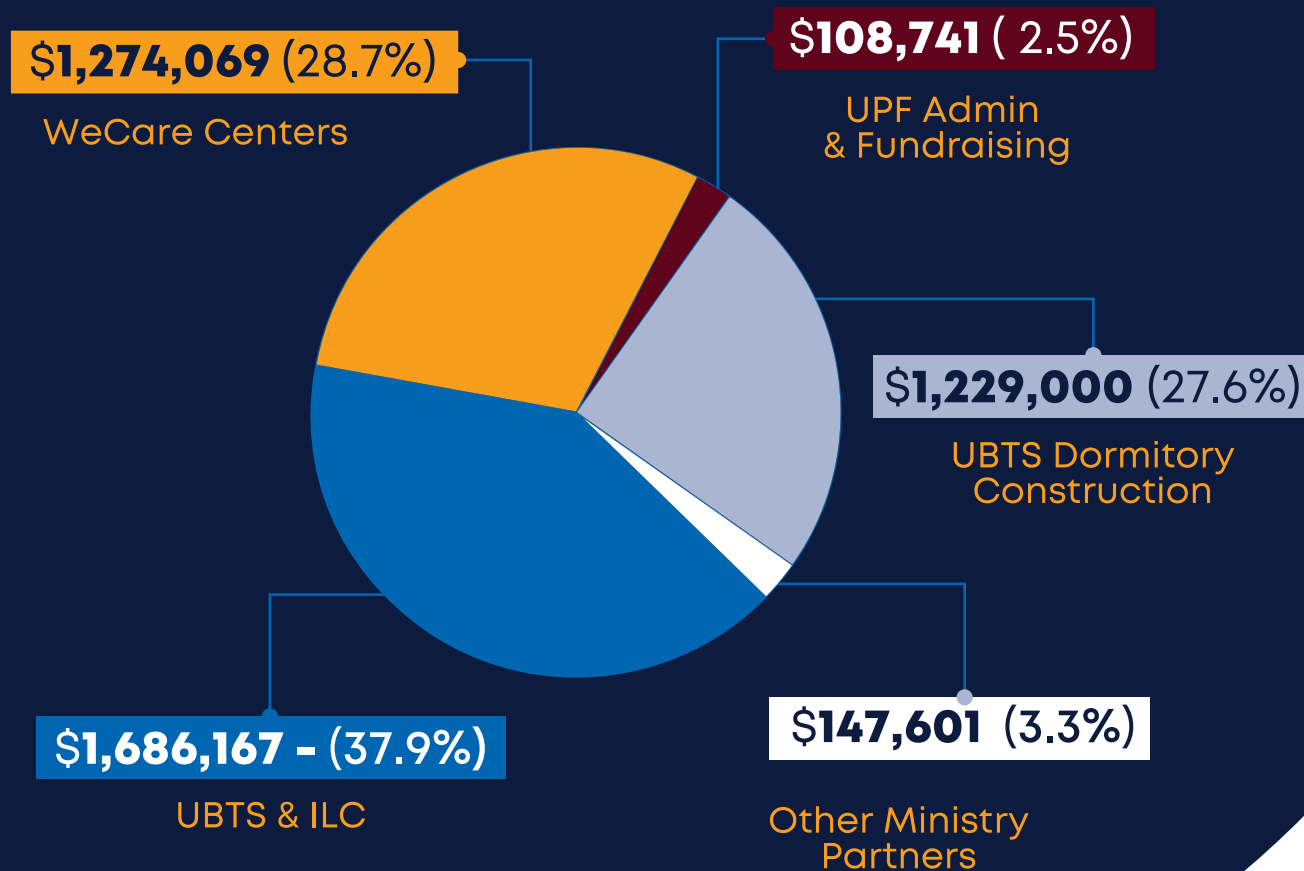
God knit the dream into Margarita's heart ever since she was a teenager: an equine therapy center for children and parents. But when Russia invaded Ukraine and destroyed her home in Zaporizhia, it seemed that dream would be reduced to rubble, too.

Then she started studying at the Institute for Leadership & Coaching and found a place, and people, who believed in her God-sized dream.

"I would come home filled with ideas, with hope, and with the certainty that, yes, it will work," says Margarita.

From her new home in Zakarpattia, Margarita now sees people leave her center differently than they came, and it's not just because of the horses or the people who meet them there. "It's because God is here." Margarita says. "Through our work, through our care, and through love, we can help rebuild lives and **even share the Gospel through it all.**"
